Menindee Lakes

Located approximately 110 kilometres south-east of Broken Hill, the Menindee Lakes are a series of water catchments along the Darling River. The lakes can hold three and half times as much water as Sydney Harbour when full.





Whether your interests consist of relaxing on the river bank, setting up camp or cruising the waterways, the Menindee Lakes provide the perfect getaway.

The thriving natural environment fosters a large variety of native wildlife, supporting up to 222,000 water birds. This area, along the Darling River, is recognised as one of the finest freshwater fishing spots in New South Wales.






Mundi Mundi Plains
